Jeremiah is given an <u>unshakable purpose</u>. (v 4-5)

Jeremiah's Calling (God's "I" Statements to Jeremiah)

- I formed you.
- I knew you.
- I consecrated you.
- I appointed you.

Jeremiah gives the <u>usual excuses</u>. (v 6)

Jeremiah's Excuses (Jeremiah's "I" Statements to God)

• I am not skilled enough.

⁴ The word of the Lord came to me. saving.

⁶ "Alas, Sovereign Lord," I said, "I do not know how to speak; I am too young."

⁷ But the Lord said to me, "Do not say, 'I am too young.' You must go to everyone I send you to and say whatever I command you. ⁸ Do not be afraid of them, for I am with you and will rescue you," declares the Lord.

⁹ Then the Lord reached out his hand and touched my mouth and said to me, "I have put my words in your mouth. ¹⁰ See, today I appoint you over nations and kingdoms to uproot and tear down, to destroy and overthrow, to build and to plant."

- Do not be afraid.
- I am with you.
- I will rescue you.
- I have put my words in your mouth.

Jeremiah is given a message that God will uproot to replant. (v10)

• Jeremiah is pointing us to <u>Jesus</u>. (Jeremiah 31:31-34)

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
